## TAKAHIRO YAMAMOTO: Possibility of Opaqueness

Property of Opaqueness is the first iteration of choreographer Takahiro Yamamoto's project under the umbrella titled Opacity of Performance. This multi-year project investigates visibility and the physical and emotional effects that performers and viewers undergo when acts of looking, moving, and paying attention vary over an extended duration. When does visibility/invisibility validate the performer and when does it negate them? What are the social consequences of looking at a performing body today?

This timely and urgent commentary on contemporary masculinity places a trans and queer lens onto intersectional questions of embodiment, violence, Black queer love, whiteness, shame and posturing. In turns powerful, explosive, irreverent, devastatingly honest, sensual and humorous, BOYS IN TROUBLE is a groundbreaking examination of American masculinity's deep roots in Trouble.

# KEITH HENNESSY: *Sink*

Sink's approach to current politics wavers between punk and contemplative, transformative and fucked. Loneliness, a lifejacket, a white man, a shadow dance, a long angry sad song, and love, suspended. Featuring poetic texts, contemplative dances, dark satire, plaintive chanting, re-processed nazi music, and an aerial dance, Sink is an intimate and confrontational portrait of the current era through the embodied perspective of a middle aged, white, gay male artist.

Next Fest NW is Velocity's new works series celebrating what's happening in contemporary dance, movement-based performance and dance cinema in the region. Next Fest NW was established to support new work and investigate different approaches to dance. Through Next Fest NW, Velocity fosters a robust community where artists have access to facilities, support and creative exchange.

## GABRIELLE CIVIL/WILD BEAUTY: What happens if we take our time?

a Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. ritual / black movement intensive JAN 12-18 / 7:30PM

What does it mean to dance (blackness) in blackness? In the heart of winter, how can we bloom, share breath, conjure, heal, and experiment with joy? What happens if we take our time? Wild Beauty opens space for four core black artists—Gabrielle Civil, Randy Ford, Neve Mazique-Bianco, and Fox Whitney—to work/ play together in an MLK ritual/ black movement intensive. In the week leading up to MLK's birthday, these core artists will take residency at Velocity to move in blackness across/beyond spectrums of gender, sexuality, queerness, ability, and art.
